On Fraternity and Social Friendship (Fratelli Tutti)

Pope Francis has written the third Encyclical of his pontificate, *Fratelli Tutti*, which was released on October 3, 2020. This new Encyclical speaks directly to the lives of men and women today. It is a beautiful reflection on humanity's path forward to a deeply desired peace and is addressed "to all people of good will, regardless of their religious convictions."

Archbishop Jose H Gomez, president of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, has welcomed this recent work as an "important contribution to the Church's rich tradition." He reflects on the Pope's call for a new commitment to seek the unity of the human family: "God's plan for humanity has implications for every aspect of our lives—from how we treat one another in our personal relationships to how we organize and operate our societies and economies." The Holy Father "calls us to build a common future that truly serves the good of the human person." He "challenges us to overcome the individualism in our culture and to serve our neighbors in love, seeing Jesus Christ in every person and seeking a society of justice and mercy, compassion and mutual concern." He asks that we create a culture of sharing, interdependence, dialogue, openness and encounter.

In the background of the encyclical is the Covid-19 pandemic which, Francis admits, "unexpectedly erupted" as he was writing it. But this global health emergency only emphasizes the fact that "no one can face life in isolation" and that the time has come "to dream as a single human family in which we are all "brothers and sisters" and arise "as stars shining in the midst of darkness."
